Nixa Trail Meeting is a Success

Nixa area residents had the opportunity to share feedback on the future of bicycle and pedestrian trail development in their community on Tuesday night. Resident were asked to place their 'dots' to vote for their preferred type of trail and the kind of amenities they want to see at future trail heads. Attendees also had the opportunity to draw proposed trails on a tabletop map and how the future trails might connect to the city's on-street bike network.

To extend the community conversation, the Ozarks Transportation Organization (OTO) and Nixa Parks and Recreation are offering a one-week comment period to collect additional input.

Citizens can go to the *X Center* in Nixa to review a project map and propose trail corridors or identify important community destinations. Comments can also be made at giveusyourinput.org. We ask that comment be submitted by April 27.



The community will have an opportunity to review trail corridors proposed by the project consultant in late May 2018. The study will be completed in June 2018 and add critical information about the Nixa community to the OTO's Regional Bicycle and Pedestrian Trail Investment Study.
