The Ozarks Transportation Organization is pleased to announce the completion of its *Regional Bicycle and Pedestrian Trail Investment Study*. The goal of the trail study is to provide a framework for connecting communities with trails. This study provides regional leaders with information on the cost of implementing a regional bicycle and pedestrian trail network. It also provided refined alignments for individual trails within that regional network. The study is available at www.giveusyourinput.org. This latest information will help community leaders make future funding decisions, understand the scope of trail network development, and provide a framework for prioritizing future projects.

The proposed regional trail network included in this study contains nearly 76 miles of trail corridors. The corridors connect OTO communities and provided key linkages within the City of Springfield. Through this study, alternative alignments within each corridor were developed, the alignments were evaluated, and costs were estimated for the preferred alignment.

The regional trail network included in this investment study could cost approximately \$100 million and \$103 million to construct. Funding has not been identified for these trail projects, but now community leaders have details they can use to plan, select, and advance projects. The study considered environmental concerns, easements needed, and the costs of individual trail segments.

OTO sought in involve the community throughout the development of this project. Public meetings were held during April and June 2016 to seek input on the development of this study. A website, www.ototrailstudy.com, was created to share project information and gather feedback. Input received was incorporated into the study and effected proposed trail alignments.

This study was led by Alta Planning + Design, Inc., a nationally recognized multi-modal transportation firm that specializes in the planning, design, and implementation of bicycle,

pedestrian, greenway, park, and trail corridors and systems. The firm is based in Portland, OR, with offices in St. Louis, Kansas City, and Bentonville, AR. Also involved were CFS Engineers, and CJW Transportation Consultants.
